Dear Brothers and Sisters,

January 1st is the Solemnity of Mary, the holy mother of God, who is also our spiritual mother. In the Gospel, this weekend the shepherds arrive in Bethlehem after being told by an angel that a Savior has been born. The Church today honors the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was chosen by God the Father to be the mother of His Son. As Jesus was both fully human and divine, the Church confesses that Mary is truly "Mother of God" (CCC 495). As a woman of faith, Mary remained close to God. She was a woman of Prayer. It is hard for people to realize that their faith life and their relationship with God depends as much on prayer as it does on discernment, study, or counseling. Luke's gospel opens with the prayer of Zechariah and Mary and closes with that of the apostles. So often we turn to God only after every other resource has been exhausted. Our time spent in prayerful reflection is seldom extended and often shortened. If Mary, who is today celebrated as the mother of God, grew in her understanding of what that means through prayer, we who strive to find meaning in our lives can do no better. Prayer is not saying a lot. Prayer is being with, being present to the God who loves us. May you all have a blessed new year. God bless.


RAMP IT UP BINGO!!!!!
