Dear Brothers and Sisters, If we want to advance in the spiritual life, we should first

consider a spiritual retreat. A "spiritual retreat" is an extended time we take to pray and ponder God's will in a sustained and focused way. Think of Moses. who made a retreat whenever he was about to do something momentous. He left ample time for solitary prayer, and then he went away to be alone with God and without distractions. Moses' retreat was a time of openness toward God. He was preparing to receive the commandments. The prophets made time for retreats as well because sometimes it takes time to discern God's voice. God called young Samuel several times by name before Samuel even recognized who was calling. Jesus did not need to make an effort in order to hear God's voice, know the Father's will, or grow in communion with God. Yet he made the effort anyway. Jesus also went on retreat when he was, like Moses, about to do something big, like naming his chosen Twelve. We too need this kind of withdrawal that Moses. Jesus, and even St. Paul modeled for us; because we need to adjust ourselves to a radically different way of thinking. Only then can we begin to discern God's will and honestly judge our lives by his standards. To think like God is a grace, but corresponding to the grace requires some effort on our part. A retreat gives us time for the effort and a near occasion of grace. The Church offers many varieties of retreat experiences: private retreats and conversational retreats, charismatic retreats and contemplative retreats; retreats for married couples and for individuals. I gravitate toward a directed retreat, with lots of time for silent prayer and opportunities, too, for private counsel. It helps me to see more clearly where and how God is calling me. May we make the time for our hearts to be open to the voice of God.

#### **Enrollment News**

We have welcomed 75 new students to St. Mary's Catholic School this year and have more coming in September and October. As our enrollment increases, so does our need for tuition assistance. At St. Mary's Catholic School we believe no child should be denied a quality Catholic education due to their parents' need for financial assistance.

St. Mary's Catholic School is blessed to have multiple sources of Tuition Assistance. These include private grants, Trust Fund disbursements, donations, Walking for Education, St. Mary's 5-K and Diocesan Funding. However, these are not enough. We must do more to keep the fund viable and growing. At this time \$160,000 in tuition assistance and negotiated tuition has been awarded.

To this end, we work tirelessly to raise money to ensure our goal is realized. I am excited to share with you that this year we have planned a number of events/activities to help us to bring in much needed financial assistance monies. Our planned activities are as follows, with more details on each event to come.

- 1. Candy sale fundraiser in September.
- 2. Motor Cycle Poker Run on October 21st
- 3. Small Business Saturday on November 25<sup>th</sup>
- 4. 5-K Fund Run in March
- 5. Walking for Education on March 28th

As you can see, there are going to be many ways in which you can help us raise money for the tuition assistance fund. With so many options, it is our hope that you will easily be able to help.
